AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHEELING WV AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ALLOCATE A PORTION OF THE WV OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDS TO ASSIST THE WHEELING POLICE DEPARTMENT IN PROVIDING OPIOID RELATED ABATEMENT

Section 1. The City of Wheeling, WV is a participating local government in various opioid-related claims which were submitted to the jurisdiction of a panel overseeing the mass litigation proceeding captioned *In Re. (Opioid Litigation, Civil Action No. 21-C-9000 (W.Va. Cir.Ct. Kanawha County))*

Section 2. The City of Wheeling, WV was apportioned a share of the WV MLP Opioid Settlement Funds.

Section 3. The Legal Department of the City of Wheeling, WV believes the uses proposed by its Police Department are within the criteria as outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding controlling the agreed use of the opioid settlement funds. *See:* The Legal Department Memorandum attached and incorporated herein.

Section 4. The City of Wheeling Police Department has provided the purpose, background and associated costs for the proposed opioid abatement expenditures of One Hundred Fifty- Two Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-Eight Dollars and Eight Cents (\$152,438.08). *See:* The Police Department's supporting documentation attached and incorporated herein. Such expenditures are to ensure appropriate resources for law enforcement to engage in enforcement and possess adequate equipment, tools and manpower to address the complexity of the opioid problem. *See generally:* Approved uses Opioid Settlement Funds-Exhibit A to West Virginia First Memorandum of Understanding; Schedule A- Core Strategies & Schedule B-Approved Uses. Specific Portions of which are included in the City Legal Department's Memorandum attached and incorporated herein.

RE : White Paper Proposal – K9 purchase through the Opioid Settlement Funds

PURPOSE

1. To obtain a decision recommending the purchase of an additional canine to fill the empty K9 handler position within the Wheeling Police Department.
2. To explain the functionality and benefits a canine has when properly trained to detect opiates and other illegal drugs, and the drug prevention efforts of the Wheeling Police Department K9 Unit.

FUNCTIONALITY

1. Olfactory Receptors And History Of Canines Used For Scent Detection

On average a canine possesses up to 300 million olfactory receptors in their noses compared to approx 6 million in humans. Also, the area of a canine's brain that is devoted to analyzing smells is about 40 times greater than that of a human. Studies have shown that humans had been utilizing canines for their superior sense of smell as early as 600 B.C. More notably the start of the first canine training facility in Ghent, Belgium in 1899 which resulted in the NYPD establishing the first Police Canine program in the United States in 1907.

2. Police Canine's And Their Roles In Law Enforcement In Current Times

Currently in the United States there is believed to be approx 50,000 active police canines supporting law enforcement operations. Law Enforcement agencies around the United States utilize canines for a wide variety of tasks. The most common task being odor detection. The two most popular areas of odor detection are that of illegal drugs, and explosives.

3. Police Canine's And Their Role Within The Wheeling Police Department

The Wheeling Police Department K9 Unit was formed in 2003 and currently has 3 active canines. With the retirement of K9 Zero in late 2023 there is now the need for an

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additional canine to replace K9 Zero as the city has allotted 4 K9 handler positions within the Wheeling Police Department. The WPD K9 Unit supplements the Patrol Division. Of the 3 active canines, 2 are trained in the detection of illegal drugs such as marijuana, cocaine, heroin, and methamphetamine (K9 Jericho / K9 Virgil). The third canine (K9 Ozzy) is trained to detect explosives. The Wheeling Police Department utilizes their canines to sniff vehicles, buildings, and anywhere else law enforcement believes illegal substances may be hidden.

DISCUSSION

1. Drug Detection & Arrests

Though statistics go back farther, statistics for the past 3 years show the Wheeling Police Department K9 Unit has seized numerous illegal drugs to include schedule 1,2,3, and 4 controlled substances. Most notably the following seizures:

Cocaine: 226.34 grams

Heroin: 49.79 grams

Fentanyl: 179.8 grams and 63 pressed Fentanyl pills

Marijuana: 8,093.85 grams

In that 3 year period the Wheeling Police Department K9 Unit has also made 467 arrests. The vast majority of arrests are directly related to drug activity.

2. Overdoses And Drug Related Crimes

In 2022 the Wheeling Police Department responded to 164 overdoses. In 2023 the Wheeling Police Department responded to 182 overdoses, an 11% increase. Of those 164 overdoses in 2022, 11 resulted in an overdose death. Of the 182 overdoses in 2023, 26 resulted in an overdose death, a 136% increase. The City of Wheeling continues to see drug related crimes such as thefts and other crimes causing quality of life issues for its citizens and visitors to the city.

3. Proactive Policing And Drug Prevention Efforts

The Wheeling Police Department K9 Unit regularly conducts foot patrols in areas known to law enforcement as being "hotspots" for drug activity. These areas include homeless encampments, high-rise apartment buildings, and other facilities.

The Wheeling Police Department K9 Unit also regularly participates in K9 demonstrations and drug prevention discussions for numerous schools in the area, the D.A.R.E. program, and the National Night Out.

4. Cost

On average the purchase of a drug detection canine and subsequent canine handler training course costs between \$15,000 to \$20,000. The purchase price for all active canines for the Wheeling Police Department were within those numbers.

CONCLUSION

The purchase of another drug detection canine would greatly benefit the mission of the Wheeling Police Department. With their superior sense of smell past and present canines have been an invaluable tool for the department in locating evidence of drug related crimes. The available funds through this settlement are a natural fit for the purchase of a police canine due to its drug enforcement and drug prevention tasks.

RE : Decision Paper, Utility Tasked Vehicle (UTV)

PURPOSE

1. To obtain a decision recommending equipment to purchase and training to start a Utility Tasked Vehicle (UTV) program at the Wheeling Police Dept.
2. To explain the functionality and benefits of using a UTV in a law enforcement setting.

FUNCTIONALITY

1. Situational Awareness – ability to target non-traditional patrol areas

The City of Wheeling is home to an extensive trail network designed to provide the citizens of Wheeling an opportunity to enjoy the outdoors. The Greater Wheeling Trail, also referred to as Heritage Trail, and its related pathways cover a span of over 18 miles with several connected trails and pathways. The primary agency tasked with covering most of these trails is the Wheeling Police Department. However, not all parts of the trail network are accessible by standard police patrol cruisers. With the addition of department UTV's, the Wheeling Police Department will be given the ability to patrol the trail network in its entirety including reaching hard to access areas.

2. Drug Enforcement within the homeless community

Like most cities in the United States, the City of Wheeling is battling a significant rise in illegal activity within the homeless population. Calls of service for suspicious activity, drug activity, and overdoses have all increased. According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, the average homeless person has a 26% higher chance of issues with substance abuse. In addition, the Wheeling Police Department has seen trends where individuals have targeted the homeless population for this very reason. However, enforcement has proven difficult with the homeless community due to both a distrust of law enforcement along with difficulty physically accessing the

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homeless due to encampments being placed in hard-to-reach areas which are not accessible by traditional law enforcement vehicles.

DISCUSSION

1. Trail Enforcement

With the addition of UTV's into the Wheeling Police fleet, Officers will be given a new tool to fight the increase in drug-related crime on the trail network. The addition of UTV's will result in increased patrol of the Heritage Trail network by assigning Officers to directed patrols solely focusing on the trail and the surrounding areas, including hard-to-reach paths to areas where illegal activity is known to occur.

From 6/1/2023 through 8/31/2023, a study of the homeless community within the City of Wheeling conducted by the Wheeling Police Office of Crime Analysis showed that the majority of reported crimes (36%) involving homeless individuals were quality-of-life issues, which includes drug related offenses. The majority of these incidents happened in the area of Heritage Port, part of the Heritage Trail network, that is easily accessible and patrolled. This study would lead one to believe that if enforcement was expanded throughout the trail network that quality-of-life crime enforcement would also increase in that expanded area.

2. Enforcement and Outreach in the Homeless Community

As noted, the homeless population is a major contributor to drug crime in the City of Wheeling. These individuals generally reside within encampments, deep in wooded areas, far from the eye of the public. These encampments are also far from the eye of law enforcement as they generally are in hard-to-reach areas that require Officers to separate themselves from their patrol vehicle, a dangerous practice which impacts Officer safety as well the ability to respond quickly to emergencies. Some encampments within the City of Wheeling are over 1 mile off the main roads, down paths that used to hold railway tracks, through tunnels once used by trains, and up abandoned roadways.

In February 2024, The Wheeling Police Department was notified of a drug trafficking ring in the Wheeling area targeting the homeless population. It should be noted that this is a current investigation, therefore details which can be released are limited. Intelligence of the situation shows that the individual in charge of this ring uses homeless individuals to target the local homeless camps to sell drugs. The lead individual "pushes" the product by having homeless individuals go to the homeless camps in the area and sell the drugs to the local homeless population. The areas of the city most impacted by this ring, Wheeling Island and East Wheeling, are two of the top three leading reported overdose areas (East Wheeling (18.1%) being number one and Wheeling Island (15.3%) being number 3). Furthermore, it should be noted that the downtown patrol area (beat 31) which covers East Wheeling and borders Wheeling Island (beat 51) as well as South Wheeling (beat 32) had 59.3% of the combined overdoses that occurred in Wheeling in 2023. All of these areas, even Wheeling Island

via bridge, are connected by the Heritage Trail network and home to the majority of the homeless encampments in Wheeling.

The homeless issue continues to be a hot topic in the City of Wheeling. As many residents show concern for the quality-of-life issues regarding the homeless population, a more organized and managed method is currently being implemented. In 2023, with the passage of a new city ordinance in the City of Wheeling, an awareness for the need of a managed camp became apparent. Originally housed in a temporary urban setting, the managed homeless encampment will soon be relocated to a more secluded area. This area known by locals as the "dog pound" is located off the main road and will require additional patrol as a large amount of the city's homeless population will be residing there. As part of a directed patrol program that will encompass the city's trail network, this homeless encampment can also be patrolled by UTV with ease which would be much more practical than a traditional patrol vehicle.

Lastly, the Wheeling Police Department prides itself with 21st century community-oriented policing. This has been done in several ways, including adding positions such as Victim Advocates and the soon-to-be Peer Recovery Support Specialist. The ability to reach victims and those suffering from substance abuse is key, however, those in the homeless community do not always have access to traditional means of communication. A UTV could be utilized to bring these resources to the homeless population by visiting homeless encampments to make contact with victims and perform outreach for those suffering with addiction in an effort to battle the drug epidemic in the city.

3. Rapid Deployment

In addition to a Police Department UTV, a rapid deployment UTV located in a strategic area of the city and housed in an enclosed trailer ready for pickup attachment can allow Officers to quickly hook up the trailer and take the UTV to wherever it is needed. The rapid deployment UTV could be transported throughout the City of Wheeling and neighboring communities relatively quickly, including for use in drug enforcement efforts.

CONCLUSION

The addition of a UTV(s) to the Wheeling Police Department would greatly benefit the City of Wheeling and those who live in and visit the city. As crime continues to increase throughout the city, specifically drug-related offenses, the extra presence of Police Officers and increased patrol on the Heritage Trail network, including hard to reach areas plagued by illegal activity, could be hit head on opening the doors to battle an unofficial drug trail network and those that it impacts. This increase in patrol would help the Wheeling Police Department create a safer and more drug-free environment for those who live, work, and visit the City of Wheeling.

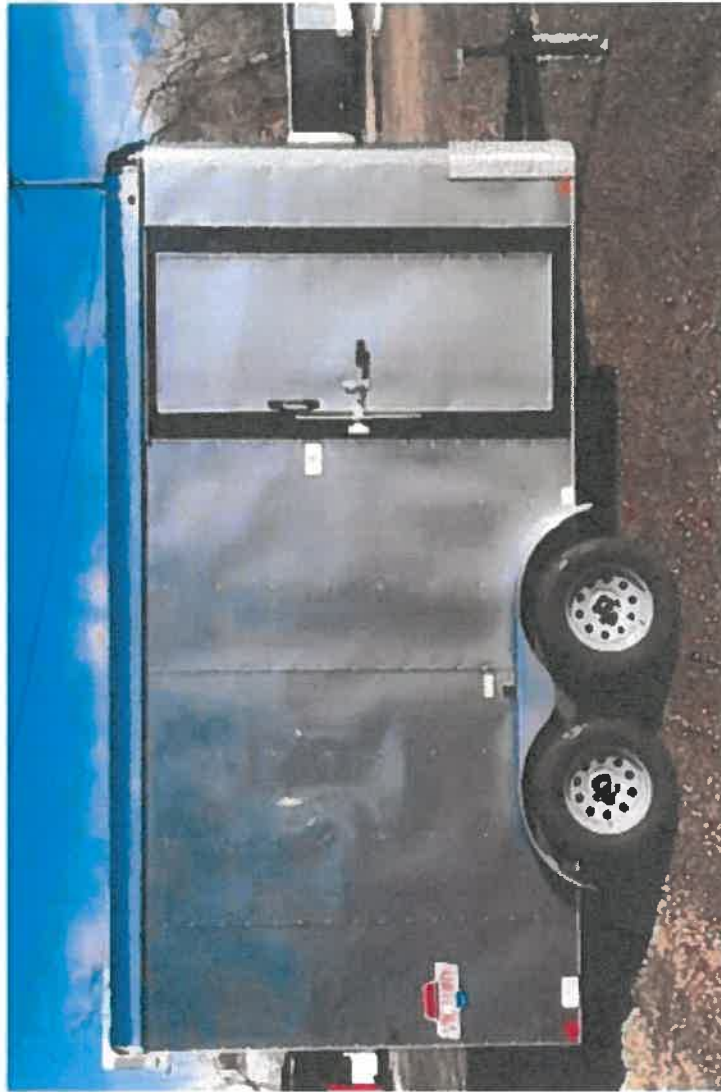

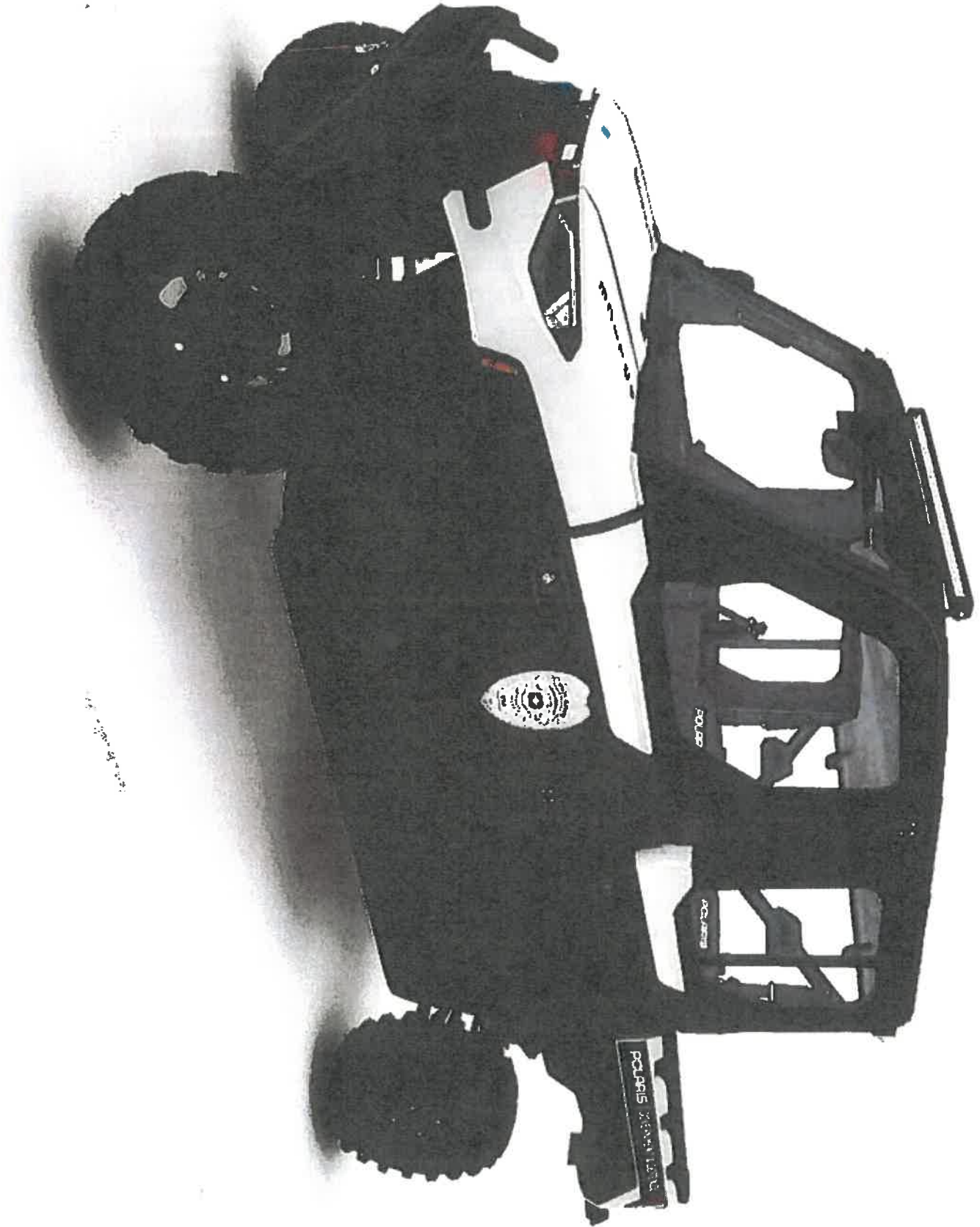

How it will help:

This program will be used as part of the Crisis Intervention Team Trainings. It will also be incorporated as an additional resource to the Mental Health First Aid training. The Hearing Voices Simulation provides users with a first person experience of what it is like for those living with auditory hallucinations. This knowledge and experience will help first responders be more alert, more empathetic, and better equipped to serve those suffering from auditory hallucinations.

According to the World Health Organization, "Schizophrenia affects approximately 24 million people or 1 in 300 people worldwide." With this number, it is inevitable that first responders will encounter persons suffering from schizophrenia. The Cleveland Clinic states, "approximately 75% of people with schizophrenia experience auditory hallucinations — usually hearing voices."

Although auditory hallucinations are mostly associated with schizophrenia, several other mental health conditions also cause people to hear voices such as:

- 20% to 50% of people with bipolar disorder.
- 40% of people with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).
- 14% of people with an anxiety disorder.
- 10% of people with major depression."

Other causes of auditory hallucinations include:

- Alcohol and recreational drug use.
- Lack of sleep.
- Certain prescribed medications (as a side effect).
- Extreme stress or grief.

The National Library of Medicine states, "numerous reports exist of hallucinations attributed to opioids, which have been typically described as auditory, visual, or rarely tactile hallucinations. Hallucinations with fentanyl use have been reported to occur at a rate as high as 6% (5 of 82 patients) during its use in patient-controlled intravenous analgesia for postoperative acute pain management."

Psychiatric Services states, "Arrest rates are generally higher among individuals who have schizophrenia than in community samples of persons who do not have mental illness. People with schizophrenia may be more likely to be arrested because they behave oddly as a result of their illness."

With the information provided from the World Health Organization, the Cleveland Clinic, the National Library of Medicine, and the Psychiatric Services, it is imperative for first responders to have adequate training in recognizing the effects auditory hallucinations may have on those suffering.

Example

As previously stated, auditory hallucinations can occur from a variety of mental health disorders such as schizophrenia, bi-polar, post traumatic stress disorder, anxiety, depression. It can also occur in alcohol or drug use, particularly with opioids including fentanyl. With the opioid epidemic currently affecting our state, it is likely first responders will encounter those having auditory hallucinations caused by the drug use.

By purchasing Pat Deegan's Hearing Voices Simulation Toolkit for First Responders along with two (2) additional packs of 10 MP3 Players (**total cost \$1,179**) with the preloaded audio, we will be able to provide first responders and other attendees a hands-on first person experience of auditory hallucinations. This experience will help those responding to calls regarding people hearing voices have a better understanding of what that person is experiencing. This will lead first responders to better deescalation strategies if the person does not respond to typical commands from officers which will lead to a safer outcome for all parties involved.

RE : Request for Department Purchases using the Opioid Settlement Funds

Chief Schwertfeger,

I spoke with Detective Cpl. Erick Burke regarding opioid settlement funds, and inquired if there were any beneficial tools the Ohio Valley Drug Task Force could benefit from if approved for purchase.

I have attached a couple of requests from Cpl. Burke. The first is for an Advanced Covert Technology Quad IP Camera Drop Kit, along with 2 Die Hard marine batteries to power the device/camera. The investigator would put a camera into a drop car. This could be placed in areas where we are receiving drug complaints, or are currently working active drug investigations. This will allow for surveillance without an officer needing to be present, and can be observed through live feed by means of the committed cellular service, either through a mobile device or computer. When attached to a marine batter, it will allow for approx. 56 straight hours of run time. Cpl. Burke has requested two, to allow for one to be on charge while the other is in use.

The total quote for the camera set is **\$14,882**, and for the Die-Hard marine batteries **\$336.74**. The other additional cost would be for a cellular line with a SIM card to be installed into the device. Sgt. Howell

Example

advised me the current discounted cost to the police department is \$36.99 per month through First Net (AT&T), which would total **\$443.88** annually.

The second request is to cover the annual licensing fee for the XRY Machine that the Ohio Valley Drug Task Force utilizes for extracting cellular phone data after obtaining a search warrant. This is a frequently utilized machine which has been very beneficial in Overdose, Overdose Death, and Delivery of Controlled Substance investigations, just to name a few. The invoice for the annual fee lists a cost of **\$2,995**.

Sgt. Hupp also proposed the purchase of a TruNarc handheld narcotics analyzer, which would be used for the purpose of field-based presumptive testing of suspected narcotics. This would allow for fast and accurate drug identification. This unit conducts non-contact sampling, which can scan for the presence of the drugs through plastic or glass, which minimizes contamination, and reduces exposure to preserve evidence. The device automatically generates a tamper-proof report, with test location, time, result, and operator, for full inclusion in the investigative file.

This would not only be safer for the officers conducting the testing, but would eliminate the need to purchase a multitude of one time use presumptive drug testing kits. This has an overall cost of **\$33,133.00**, but over time would save money. This cost includes on-site instructor training for up to 12 officers, who in turn can instruct the entire department through their respective shifts. The invoice and supporting documents are attached.

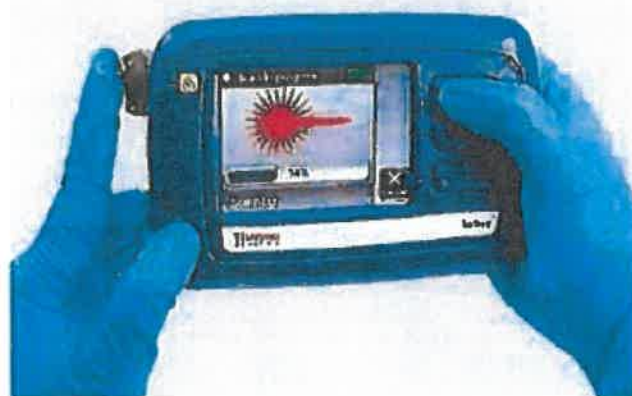

Introduction

Many common controlled substances are easily identified with the Thermo Scientific™ TruNarc™ analyzer, using point-and-shoot analysis. Some substances, however, exhibit fluorescence or are present in very low concentrations. These target samples can present a challenge for Raman spectroscopy, requiring an additional step to ensure successful analysis.

Many of the most common controlled substances, such as cocaine and methamphetamine, are highly amenable to Raman spectroscopy and present few analysis challenges. The TruNarc analyzer has been successfully deployed for presumptive analysis of these and other suspected narcotics worldwide.

However, a phenomenon known as fluorescence can mask the Raman spectrometry signal of some narcotics, much like glare from sunlight can mask the subject in a photo from a camera. Fluorescence can hinder data collection of some narcotics, such as street heroin.



In addition, the target chemical in suspected narcotics may not be present in high enough concentration for conventional Raman spectroscopy to identify it. For instance, the active components in some prescription drugs are in a very low concentration, making identification a challenge.

To overcome these challenges – yet maximize the benefits of a handheld Raman analyzer – we have developed a Solution Kit (Type H) that enhances the Raman signal of the target substance while decreasing any nuisance fluorescence.

Recommendations for Type H kit use

Initially, TruNarc users should scan a sample using point-and-shoot mode. If this approach leads to an "Inconclusive" or "Clear" result and a specific narcotic is believed to be present, the operator should apply the Type H kit. The kit could be used to help identify these items:

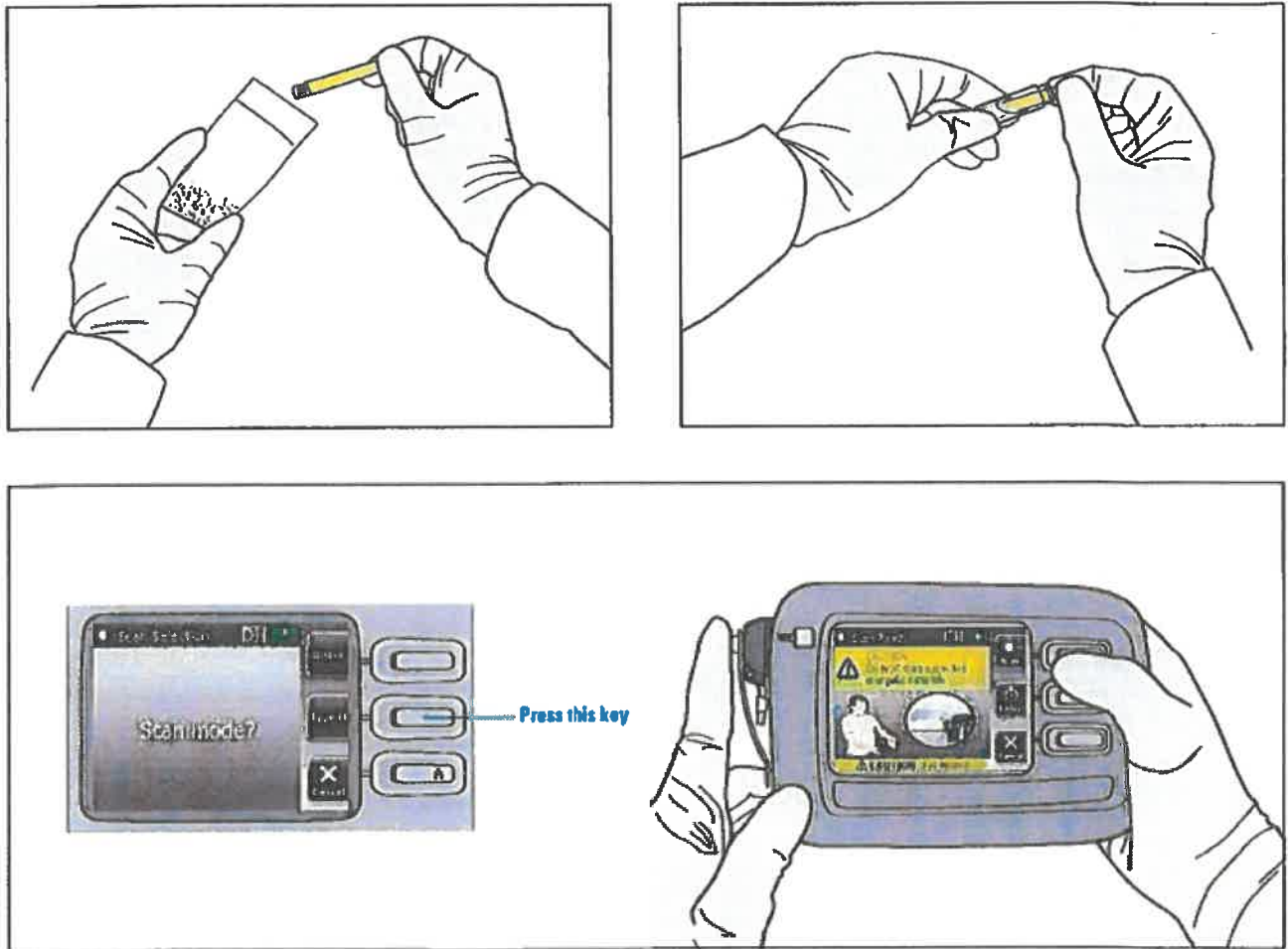
How to use the Type H kit

The Type H test kit is made up of two components: a test stick and a test vial. The vial contains 1ml of ethanol that is used to dissolve a small amount of the sample. The test stick is used first to scoop the material from the sample or a piece of tablet and transfer it to the vial.

The stick contains a metal substrate at the base of the scoop. After the chemical(s) are dissolved in the ethanol, the test stick is submerged into the vial, coating the metal substrate with the solution. The test stick is then removed, allowed to dry, positioned against the TruNarc analyzer, and scanned. See Figure 2

This method has been shown to increase the spectrum strength and reduce the amount of fluorescence for certain samples.

Figure 2. Process for analysis using a TruNarc Type H kit

Science behind the Type H kit

The roughened metal surface on the Type H test stick has two primary attributes. First, the surface quenches the fluorescence, the phenomenon that may prevent analysis of the bulk material. Second, the surface enhances the Raman signal of the molecules adsorbed onto the surface of the roughened metal, which allows analysis of very small amounts of material.

When the TruNarc analyzer is used to measure the Type H stick, the laser light is focused onto the metal surface. As with point-and-shoot analysis, the spectrometer measures the unique spectral fingerprint of the molecules, and then compares the data collected with the on-board TruNarc library.

It should be noted that the spectra obtained on the test stick are different from those of a conventional Raman spectrum. To enable these new applications using the Type H Kit, Thermo Fisher Scientific scientists create a library item for each unique chemical using certified laboratory standards.

Summary

The Type H test kit further enhances the real-world utility of the TruNarc analyzer, enabling users to screen for specific narcotics that are fluorescent and/or at low concentration. A key enhancement is the ability to use the TruNarc analyzer to screen for such emerging synthetic opioids as fentanyl, fentanyl analogs, heroin and methamphetamine. Several low dose tablets are also identifiable using the Type H test kit in conjunction with the TruNarc analyzer for presumptive narcotics identification.

All payments shall be made in U.S. Dollars.

5. DELIVERY CANCELLATION OR CHANGES BY BUYER. The Products will be shipped to the destination specified by Buyer, F.O.B. shipping point. Attached to this email is the invoice to the Advanced Covert Technology Quad IP Camera Drop Kit and 2 Diehard Marine Battery's to power the device/camera. This invoice covers everything shown under the attached page on the surveillance equipment catalog.

I spoke to Ryan Mitchell with Advanced Covert Technology, and the only other thing we would need is to add another cellular line with SIM Card to be installed into the device.

As we previously spoke about, we would be looking to utilize this camera system in a "drop car" in areas we have active drug investigations, areas where we are receiving drug complaints, or problem areas in general. The system will be installed in the trunk area of the vehicle, and the cameras will be covertly set up inside the vehicle to record target areas outside of the vehicle. The vehicle will then be left in the target area, and the device will record without investigators being present at that location. Additionally, investigators will be able to view the cameras live via smart phone or laptop. Since it is going to be used in a vehicle, it will allow investigators to utilize it almost anywhere a vehicle can travel to include streets, parking lots, ect.

This device will be extremely beneficial to surveillance operations and intel gathering during drug related investigations, as it alleviates law enforcement officers from being in the area and possibly being detected by suspects, thus compromising an investigation. This device will allow us to review the video remotely and live. It is estimated we will get approximately 56 hours of consistent record time on the device while using the marine batteries. As you will notice there are two batteries priced at advanced auto parts, so we would run one with the device, and have the other to swap it out after it dies. The kit does come with a battery box and charger that we will use to charge the dead batteries.

RE: Allocation of portions of the WV Opioid Settlement Funds to assist the Wheeling Police and Fire Departments in providing Opioid Related Abatement.

The City of Wheeling, WV is a participating local government in various opioid-related claims which were submitted to the jurisdiction of a panel overseeing the mass litigation proceeding captioned *In Re: Opioid Litigation, Civil Action No. 21-C-9000 (W. Va. Cir.Ct. Kanawha County)*. The City of Wheeling, WV was apportioned a share of the WV MLP Opioid Settlement Funds. The Legal Department of the City of Wheeling, WV believes the uses proposed by its Police Department are within the criteria as outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding controlling the agreed use of the opioid settlement funds.

The City of Wheeling Police and Fire Departments have provided the purpose, background and associated costs for the proposed opioid abatement expenditures. Such expenditures are to ensure appropriate resources for law enforcement to engage in enforcement and possess adequate equipment, tools and manpower to address the complexity of the opioid problem. (see generally Approved uses Opioid Settlement Funds-Exhibit A to West Virginia First Memorandum of Understanding; Schedule A- Core Strategies & Schedule B-Approved Uses. Specific Portions of which are included this City of Wheeling, WV Legal Department's Memorandum attached and incorporated herein.

The proposed uses by the Police and Fire Departments are generally covered in Schedule B- Approved Uses-Section M LAW ENFORCEMENT which reads as follows:

Example

M. LAW ENFORCEMENT

Ensure appropriate resources for law enforcement to engage in enforcement and possess adequate equipment, tools, and manpower to address complexity of the opioid problem.

However, there are other sections as attached which may/do apply to the proposed uses of the Departments.
