FINANCE COMMITTEE COMMENTS/FINANCIAL REPORT

Councilman Marsh explained that most of the spending related resolutions on tonight's agenda are a result of the recent council workshop relating to the disbursement of American Rescue Plan (ARP) money. Councilman Marsh further explained that there are two blanket resolutions – one for Parks and Recreation and one for the Police Department – that outline the total amounts that Council agreed to give each department. Separate resolutions have then been done for each

department's expenditures that are to be taken out of the total amounts given to them. All other items are budgeted.

Ms. Smoljanovich gave the cash report as follows:

In answer to Councilman Ash's recent inquiry of how much is left out of the \$3 million ARPA funds that were transferred to the General Fund, Ms. Smoljanovich stated that all of it is left. Last Friday the pension actuarial reports were distributed to Council. Because the required contribution for 2023 had to be estimated, it will not be known until after October 1st the actual contribution amount required, but the new actuarial company has been up every single year. The police contribution increased by \$41,702 for this fiscal year, and the fire contribution went down \$1,462. There will be a budget revision next month to allow for the additional police pension contribution. Due to the current market, the police lost over \$1.2M - or 10.5% - of their total investments, and fire lost \$1.9M which was almost 13%. It appears, however, that investment accounts are starting to go back up.

This is just the first step in the process – it will be a study only with recommendations, not drawings. The next step will be to hire an architect.

CITY MANAGER AND DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

Chief Kush – Extended thanks to Council and the City Manager for implementing the take-home vehicle program. Recruiting for the police department continues, and members of the department will be attending a law enforcement job fair on Friday at Franciscan University.

Assistant City Manager – DeeAnn Pulliam – DataMax payments in September came from 23 renewal business payments totaling \$2,436.46, bringing the total collected by DataMax to \$80,765.12. Trick-or-treating is on October 29, 2022, from 5-7 p.m.; multiple contests are planned for the Christmas on Main Street Event, including a gingerbread house contest with a deadline of November 4th and a cutest Christmas pet photo contest with voting ending on November 1st.

Parks and Recreation – Coty Shingle – Mr. Shingle read a letter addressed to the City of Weirton Common Council from Edwin J. Bowman, Chairman of the Weirton Board of Park and Recreation Commissioners:

Dear Weirton City Council,

On behalf of the Weirton Board of Park & Recreation Commissioners, I would like to thank you for considering the measures you intend to take action on at this evening's meeting.

The funding you will be voting on this evening will help all of us to work together to enhance the recreation facilities throughout the city.

The capital improvements that will be undertaken as a result of these earmarked funds will be a tremendous benefit to the citizens of the City of Weirton and surrounding communities.

Once again, on behalf of the Park Board, thank you for your efforts.

Mr. Shingle also extended his gratitude to Council for their commitment to Parks and Recreation. Paving on the Panhandle Trail will start tomorrow utilizing the local money contributed. Paving will continue next spring utilizing the \$90,000 TAP grant funds received.

Library - Rik Rekowski – The Hancock County Library renewal levy on the November 8, 2022, election ballot needs 60% to pass. This is a renewal levy and not an increase levy and is important for the continued support of the county's public libraries.

City Manager – Mike Adams – A meeting took place with Mon Power to address some downtown lighting issues, primarily in the alley behind Main Street; FOIA requests continue to come in; the water leak on Brightway is being addressed; the Cove Road paving project has been delayed due to the handicap curbs that have to still be put in from Cove Road to Weirton Lumber; the estimated completion time is in the spring; the condition of and responsibility for Penco Road is being addressed; Penco Road is currently seen as an "orphan", because it is listed in the FANS

(Federal Aid Non-State) system, which means the road is not considered a State or City maintained road; AlignHR outlined about twenty points to work on including updating the policy manual/employee handbook and safety training; a rental registration meeting is taking place tomorrow, October 12th, and two inspectors have been hired for the program; Thrasher did a walk-through of the city building as the beginning steps of the building assessment; there are several change orders related to the Park Drive project and a special meeting needs to be scheduled to discuss them. Since these are all contractual matters, they will have to be discussed in executive session.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMENTS/COMMUNICATIONS

Councilman Marsh would like to see the AV equipment be used during meetings by putting the documents being voted on up on the screen. It was also expressed to possibly move from putting the meetings on Facebook to putting them on the City's website instead.
